President's Message Angus Brown

A major concern mentioned at the AGM was the decline in the number of Friends. A committee has begun work on the retention and recruiting problem.

Thanks to those who responded to the letter and questionnaire we sent to Friends who had not renewed this year. The mailing was an attempt to update our list of Friends, many of whose names we had been carrying for a lengthy time. In response to over 600 letters mailed out, about 250 of you responded and 80% of those were renewals.

Many of you had simply forgotten to renew. That is mainly our fault for not bringing the renewal date to your attention. As well, confusion existed regarding the beginning and end of the subscription year. To clarify, dues are based on the calendar year. The Executive will rectify these points in future.

Some respondents noted that they would like more news about events and exhibits in the Museum. We will try to do so, both in this newsletter and on our web site.

Others had questions about management of CWM and the Friends' influence, or if our voice is being heard. The Friends are a charity that exists to support the Canadian War Museum. While we have no voice in running the museum day to day, in the scheduling of events or in the content of exhibits, I can assure you that we are in constant and friendly contact with management and that we have frequent informal exchanges of views and informa-

tion. The Friends also have a seat on the CWM Sub-Committee of the CMCC Board, the object of this sub-committee being to give advice and counsel to the Board and management group of the Museums Corporation. So, while we are not an integral part of the management team, we have an indirect and, I believe, a listened-to voice on things that matter.

We are trying hard to ensure that you do not receive duplicate appeals for donations from the Friends and the Museum's Development Branch. To clarify, the two are separate entities. The advantage of our organization is that we can be fairly nimble and direct in how we spend the money you donate. We also try to reflect the wishes of our Friends in the projects we choose to fund. That is one way for us to exert some influence but, more importantly, to make a difference in a direct and pointed manner to the Museum. For instance, war art restoration or the refurbishment of some artifacts is supplemented by Friends' funds and would not otherwise be done as quickly due to CWM budgetary constraints.

Lastly, we recently introduced two new categories of Friends: Group Friends and Corporate Friends. The subscription rate will remain at \$25.00 per annum for individuals. Groups can subscribe at \$100.00 and businesses can become Corporate Friends at \$250.00. We would hope that all Friends will support our Corporate brethren when they can.

2007 Colonel Douglas H. Gunter History Awards

On June 5, 2007 the Canadian War Museum (CWM) announced the five winners of the 2007 Colonel Douglas H. Gunter History Awards for graduating secondary school students. The theme for this year's entries, "Canada's Changing Role in Afghanistan," coincides with the War Museum's special exhibition, AFGHANISTAN: A Glimpse of War, on display until January 6, 2008.

High school students in their final year from across Canada were invited to explore how the Canadian mission in Afghanistan has changed in the past five years, and to consider how our soldiers' presence has affected Canadians as well as the Afghan people.

A total of 65 students submitted a wide variety of original works, including essays, poems and visual art, which were judged for their creativity, scholarship, critical thinking, relevance

and ability to communicate a clear message. The following winners will each receive \$1,000 and their works will be displayed in the War Museum and posted on the CWM Web site (www.warmuseum.ca):

Lindsey MacCallum of Fredericton, N.B. for "Leaving," an account of her own emotions, thoughts and reaction in response to her brother's departure to Afghanistan in early 2007.

Kelsey Stevens of Calgary, Alta. for "To Be The End," a poem written from the perspectives of two women: the mother of a female Canadian soldier, and the mother of an Afghani boy recruited by the Taliban.

Olivia Gilmer-Chekosky of Winnipeg, Man. for "Le rôle changeant du Canada en Afghanistan," a mixed media artwork that integrates newspaper clippings, text and images.

Lindsay Steele of Campbellford,

Ont. for "Dear Mom: I Miss You," a fictional account of a Grade 8 student's reaction to her mother's deployment to Afghanistan, and a letter written from the mother's perspective.

Kelsey Epler of Edmonton, Alta. for "Crucial Changes," a pencil crayon drawing of many symbols and images relevant to Canada's role in Afghanistan.

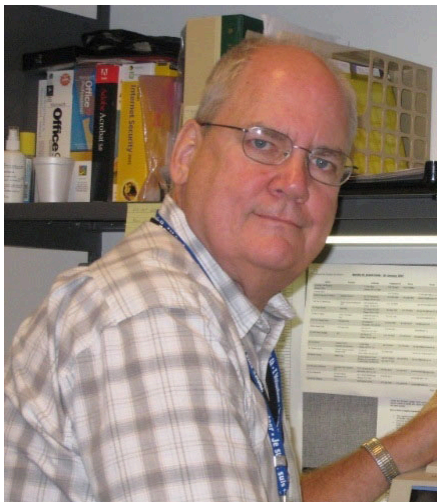
The Colonel Douglas H. Gunter History Awards, established in 2006, are funded by the Friends of the Canadian War Museum, through a bequest from Colonel Gunter's family. Beginning in 1998, the Canadian War Museum funded its own history awards. In total, some \$38,000 in prizes has been distributed to 38 students across the country.

FCWM will fund the Gunther awards in future as a way of encouraging youth involvement in Canadian military history.

Canadian War Grooms

Two years ago Mrs Judy Kozar of Winnipeg informed us that she planned to write a book on the experiences of Allied servicemen who married Canadian girls during or shortly after World War II, and asked if we could get interested Friends to contact her. Mrs Kozar's request was then published in the September 2005 issue of the Newsletter. (Volume 16 – 3).

Mrs Kozar has now informed us that "Thanks to your Newsletter, I received several war groom contacts and I was able to compile 45

wonderful stories about war grooms".

Many of the men were in Canada training with the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan and met their Canadian wives-to-be when stationed at remote bases across the country, where romances blossomed.

Tim Cook Wins History Prize

The prestigious US-based Society for Military History announced that they have awarded CWM historian Tim Cook a Moncado Prize.

Moncado Prizes are given to the authors of those articles judged to be the best in each of the four issues of the Journal of Military History, a peer-reviewed academic

journal published for the Society by the George C. Marshall Foundation and Virginia Military Institute.

Tim's paper, "The Politics of Surrender: Canadian Soldiers and the Killing of German Prisoners in the First World War" was featured in the July 2006 issue (Vol 70, No 3, pp. 637-665).

In addition to his work at the

Museum, Tim has published numerous articles and teaches part-time at Carleton University. He is also the author of two books, "No Place to Run: The Canadian Corps and Gas Warfare in the First World War" and "Clio's Warriors: Canadian Historians and the Writing of the World Wars."

Upcoming New Temporary Exhibit

Decisive Battles: Waterloo and Gettysburg in Miniature

The CWM has announced that a major temporary exhibit of two decisive battles in history will be on display for a limited time next year.

This exhibition explores the

idea that battles — such as Waterloo in 1815 and Gettysburg in 1863 — are defining moments in world history. Two huge, highly detailed scale models will take

visitors through the decisive moments of each battle, showing how topography, battlefield tactics, decision-making, luck and leadership have shaped history.

Friends' Feedback

Recent feedback from a number of Friends has raised several points that require clarification.

The first is the matter of annual dues. The calendar year is the Friends membership year so, in theory, annual subscriptions are due 01 January each year. Notice is given in the first Newsletter of the year by insertion of both a subscription/renewal form and a reply envelope. In future, to reinforce this, a notice will be placed in both the last and first Newsletters of the year.

There has also been some concern that the Newsletter does not give complete and timely coverage of upcoming special events at the Museum. Every effort is made, within the constraints of the time of issue of a quarterly newsletter, to give sufficient advance notice of these events. Obviously, this is not always possible. In this issue of the Newsletter there is a full list of CWM-sponsored learning events for the Fall (page 7). Event information will be a priority in future issues.

Finally, there appears to be some confusion as to who has free access to the Museum. The following are the only groups eligible for free admission:

- Veterans and Canadian Forces personnel with ID, accompanied by up to three family members
- Active Volunteers at the CWM and the Museum of Civilization (with valid photo ID badges), accompanied by up to 10 guests per month. Requires sign-in at the Information desk.

Discount for Friends on CD Books

Friends of the Canadian War Museum are now eligible for a 10 % discount off regular prices on purchases ordered from Archive CD Books Canada Inc. Malcolm Moody, President of Archive CD Books Canada, Inc., has agreed to give preferential pricing to all Friends.

The company (www.ArchiveCDBooks.ca) is based in Manotick and has access to over 3,000 books that have been transferred to digital format in the UK, Canada, USA and Australia. Originally growing from titles of interest to genealogists, the catalogue also now includes about 50 books on military history. Many of the Canadian books are hard-to-find titles

from the early part of the last century. Books include Nicholson's official history of the CEF, unit histories and some titles pertaining to the Boer War.

The process used to copy books is sophisticated and results in a high quality reproduction, complete with illustrations and maps in good resolution. Each book has a 'search and find' capability, greatly enhancing their use in research. Their web site describes the process and gives samples of the products.

The discount for Friends applies to ALL titles in the catalogue. The company also has a newsletter and mailing list to inform customers on new titles being added continuously.

Friends should not use the on-line shopping cart in order to get the discount. Place orders by phone, mail or email and payment can be made by cheque, money order or credit card. Simply identify yourself as a Friend of the Canadian War Museum and the discount will be applied to regular prices. There may be some restrictions on sale items, or, occasionally, Friends will find special sale prices to be a better discount.

Canadian Honours and Awards

Starting with the institution of the Order of Canada in 1967 there has been a revamping of the honours and awards available to Canadians. New Orders have been established that are Canadian. They do, however, follow the pattern of the British or Commonwealth system with which older readers will be familiar.

The senior award remains the **Victoria Cross** but there now is a Canadian version in which the words 'pro valore' replace 'for valour' of the original decoration.

Following the VC in seniority is the **Cross of Valour** (C.V.). The other Military Valour Decorations are Star of Military Valour (S.M.V. /E.V.E.) and the Medal of Military Valour (M.M.V. / M.V.M.).

The Sovereign heads the **Order of Military Merit**. This order focuses on long-term achievement. Each Governor-General becomes the Chancellor of the Order (C.M.M.). The Chief of the General Staff is named the Principal Commander of the Order (C.M.M.). The remaining three divisions of the Order are Commander (C.M.M.) Officer (O.M.M) and Member (M.M.M.). The requirements for qualification for appointment to this Order are

such that the C.M.M. is usually only available to flag or general officers; the O.M.M. to Majors to Colonels; and the M.M.M. to those of a lower rank including Non-Commissioned Members (NCMs).

Military personnel along with civilians are eligible for the three **Decorations for Bravery**. These are the Cross of Valour (C.V.), the Star of Courage (S.C/E.C/) and the Medal of Bravery (M.B.).

The **Meritorious Service Decorations** are awarded for a single military deed or activity over a specified period. The senior decoration is the Meritorious Service Cross (M.S.C. /C. S.M.) followed by the Meritorious Service Medal (M.S.M.). There are Military and Civilian Divisions.

The **Order of Canada** ranks just below the Cross of Valour. It has three divisions: Companion (C.C.), Officer (O.C.) and Member (C.M.).

More information about the Honours and Awards and the Campaign or general service medals can be found on the web site) of VAC. (www.vac.gc.ca). There is also an excellent booklet produced by DND entitled *Canadian Honours and Awards*. This
